2. Repeat the Pledge of Allegiance.
3. Demonstrate the Scout Salute, Sign, handshake and describe when they are used.
4. Show how to tie a square knot.
5. Describe the Scout badge and what the different parts of it represent.
6. Understand and be able to talk about the Scout Oath, Scout Slogan, Scout law, Outdoor code, and Scout Motto.
7. Participate in a Scoutmaster conference (a general discussion with the Scoutmaster about yourself, family, interests, school, etc.). It is the Scout's responsibility to call for the conference with the Scoutmaster.

The challenges of the rugged trails leave each Scout with experiences which he will treasure for a lifetime. He will return from his High Adventure trip a stronger person with a truer sense of himself and what he can achieve. For in meeting the physical challenges of the trek and in learning to work with his crew, the Scout learns that he can accomplish more than he ever imagined.
