

Community Service

Service to the community and others is an important part of the Scouting program. As Scouts, you are expected to be very active in this area. It may be through a troop service project for our sponsoring organization, participating in an Eagle Project, helping out with the Cub Scout program, or just service to the community.

Not only will you feel good about yourself as you help others, but you will also be providing valuable support to the community where you live. We have set a goal each year of "1000 Hours of Service" to the community. This will include hours for the entire troop and family members who take part in the service projects.

To earn the "Community Service" award, a Scout must participate in four service projects, and accumulate a minimum of twelve service hours. The first time a Scout earns the award, he is presented with a "Community Service" patch for his uniform. Every time the award is earned after that, a service pin will be awarded indicating how many times the Scout has qualified for the award.
